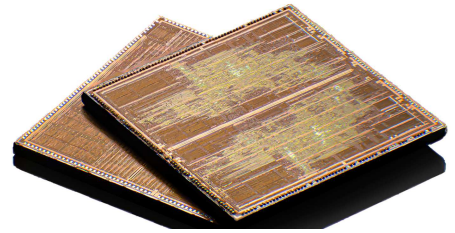

## 2 Steps before Arrival

### Preparations in Your Home Country

You have to be well prepared at your home country before you arrive at Kassel. For further information and tips, ask your buddies or the welcome centre tutors before arrival.



### Schedule of Courses

Information about courses at the University of Kassel can be found here. The course catalogue for the winter or summer semesters will be updated on 1<sup>st</sup> September and 1<sup>st</sup> March, respectively. You can check out the schedule of courses (*ger.* Vorlesungsverzeichnis) on the university website and section 4.6 of this booklet.

### Visa

As soon as you receive an admission letter from the University of Kassel, you will be able to apply for a visa from the German embassy or consulate in your home country or country of residence. The addresses of German embassies and consulates and information regarding entry requirements can be found on the website of the German Federal Foreign Office. There, you will also find information on the specific requirements for obtaining visa on a country-by-country basis.

### Accommodation

Whether you would like to stay in a student dorm or in a private apartment, cheap accommodation in Kassel is available for those who start searching early. Those who start late will likely find more expensive accommodation. It can often take weeks to find accommodation; therefore, we advise you to start searching as soon as possible.

### Health Insurance

In Germany, every citizen is required to have a health insurance.

- Non-EU citizens: If you are a citizen from a country outside the European Union (EU), you will need to provide a health insurance certificate already upon applying for your visa. Please choose a foreign health insurance policy which covers the beginning of your stay in Germany. Check whether your policy covers a visit to the doctor and a hospital stay. In most cases, the amount insured must lie between 30,000 € and 50,000 €.
- EU citizens: If you are a citizen of the EU and you have a health insurance coverage in your country of residence, you can get the European health insurance card (EHIC). EHIC is sufficient for your stay in Germany and covers emergency treatments in all German hospitals.

### 3.1 Welcome and Registration

#### Welcome Centre in the International Office

The welcome centre in the international office is the first contact point for international students. The team of the welcome centre places special importance on individual and practical assistance and is there to support you extensively before and upon your arrival in Kassel. The international office is also in charge of formalities like e.g. applications and study affairs (cf. Admissions' Office)

A German language course at our campus in Wilhelmshöher Allee 73 for beginners up to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR) level A1 is part of the FUSE curriculum ("Social Communication" module), which is offered each semester.

There are classes from beginning to certificate level, as well as supplementary courses, language tandem programmes, the buddy programme and other foreign language activities. # 4 Steps on Arrival

## 4.1 Getting Here

How do I get to the university? Where can I catch the tram? Where can I park? And where can I find the admissions office or the international office? Directions and maps of our campuses make getting around a lot easier. Find them on our website.



### Moving In

- **Student dorms:** If you are moving into one of the student dorms, please go to the Studierendenwerk office in the Campus Center, Moritzstr. 18, ground floor, D-34127 Kassel during opening hours.
- **Private rentals:** Before your arrival, arrange a date and time of moving in with your landlord or flatmates. You should know your arrival time and have a telephone number on hand in case you are delayed.
- **Rental confirmation from landlord:** When you move in, the landlord or owner must sign a so-called “rental confirmation” (*ger.* “Wohnungsgeberbestätigung”), which you will need to show at the registration with the citizens’ office. We recommend to print out the form and ask the landlord to sign it on the day of moving in. Please download the form, fill it in and print it here.

## 4.2 Residence Registration and Permit

### Residence Registration

As legally required, you must go to the Residents’ Service Department (*ger.* Bürgerbüro) in the town hall (*ger.* Rathaus) and let them know your address in Kassel. This must be done within one month after your arrival in Kassel. You simply go in, receive a number from the information desk, and, when your number is called, you fill in the form with the help of a person who works there. You will be given a copy of this form. Keep it in a safe place. You will need this form to get your residency permit, to open a bank account, to get a library card, etc. If you move to another apartment in Kassel during your studies, you need to tell

the residence registration office your new address.

**Bank Account**

In order to pay bills or your rent, you will need an account with one of the German banks. When you have opened your bank account (*ger.* Girokonto), you will receive a bank card. You will be able to use this card as a method of payment in the majority of shops or alternatively use it to draw money from ATMs. If you work in Germany, your wage will also be transferred directly onto your bank account. You can open an account at a range of different banks. Ask whether there are special conditions for students, as service and handling charges may differ.

## Health Insurance

If you need a health insurance, take out a health insurance policy, for example with one of the public health insurance companies like e.g. AOK, TK, Barmer BKK, etc. If you have a health insurance certificate already from an insurance provider in your country of residence, for example by EHIC or a certification thereof covering your stay in Germany, a German health insurance provider can confirm that you are exempted from the domestic duty to obtain insurance. Such a confirmation can be issued by any public health insurance provider in Germany.

## 4.3 Campus Card and Internet Services

After you are officially enrolled at the University of Kassel via eCampus, you will receive an enrolment number which you need as a reference for paying the semester fees. You will receive your Campus Card once the University of Kassel has received the semester fees.

### Campus Card

The Campus card is a student ID and serves as a semester ticket for public transport close to Kassel for all students. You will receive more detailed information with your enrolment. You will also need the campus card to get access to the services of the university library.

## Internet on Campus

If you bring your own computer from home or want to rent one from the information technology service centre (ITSC) or just want to use the internet on campus, you need to contact ITSC. With your student ID you will receive a username and password.

You can then log-in to the internet via WLANs in the student housing or sign-in to a computer in the available computer rooms on campus. In most rooms at the university, you can also

Upon registration, you may use your e-mail account via an e-mail client on your computer or via the webmail interface of the University of Kassel. Before using the service, you need to activate it.



## 4.4 Expenses

Concerning expenses, you have to pay your rent, insurance, food, clothes, books, entertainment, and travel. With about 750 € per month, you can live comfortably in Kassel and will still have money left to go to a bar or the movies. There are a number of tips for saving costs when living in Kassel:

- Borrow your books for classes from the library and/or copy them at a copy shop.
- Shop at low-cost grocery stores or in second-hand shops.
- Go to the movies on days with a discount (*ger.* Kinotag), usually Mondays or Tuesdays.
- If you live with others, team up to buy big items like e.g. microwave, printer, TV, etc. to get discounts.
- Show your student ID to get student discounts in museums or recreational facilities.

## 4.5 German Language Course

All students without any German language skills or certification have to do the module “Social Communication” (6 ECTS) to pass A1 German CEFR level. The module is offered in the first semester twice a week in the afternoon and takes place at our campus in Wilhelmshöher Allee 73, which helps for integration, in particular to work in German companies. In case an FUSE student has German language skills or certifications on CEFR level A1 or A2 upon arrival in Kassel, the language module has to be replaced by a regular module.

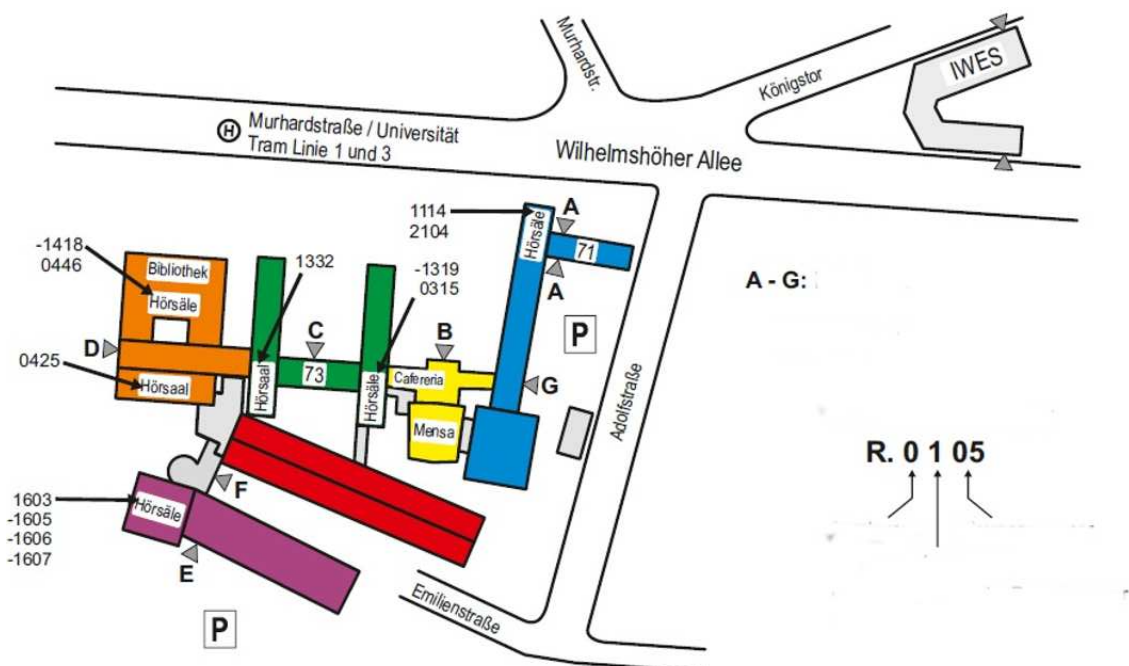

# 5 The Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science

You may find an electronic campus map of the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science here. A 2D-map is shown below.



Here, room numbers are usually characterized by four digits (cf. example of room 0105):

- The first digit refers to the floor on which the room is located.
- The second digit refers to the building.
- The last two numbers refer to the actual room number.
- A hyphen in front of a room number indicates a room in the basement.

Sometimes, the room prefix “WA” indicates the address “Wilhelmshöher Allee”.

Finally, do not be afraid to talk to your lecturers, professors and people at the faculty. Let them know you are an international student. Everyone is more than willing to help you if you are facing problems of any kind.
