Introduction

Spurred by social movements around the world, racial capitalism has become a much-debated concept in numerous fields and disciplines of critical social science, reinitiating discussions about the link between racism and capitalism. However, the frequent use of the term is often overshadowed by unclear and contradictory arguments, including issues like: Is the entanglement of racism and capitalism contingent or logically necessary? How are racism and capitalism defined and classified historically? How does the relationship between racism and capitalism differ in different world regions and time periods?

These questions are not new and follow from intense debates in the 1980s and earlier struggles within and between anti-colonial movements. In this context, it is hardly surprising that classic works of the so-called Black Radical Tradition are being re-read and reinterpreted in order to understand, criticise and overcome current conditions of capitalist and racist oppression. Based on Marxist categories and as a critique of a Eurocentric Marxism, the Black Radical Tradition has elaborated the new relevance of racism and (post-) colonialism for capitalist societies. Moreover, beyond the concept of racial capitalism, these debates are of utmost relevance for critical social theory and practice.

Yet at the same time, since at least the 1990s, tensions between Marxism and Postcolonial Studies have overshadowed progressive discussions in academia and in social movements on the connection between racism and capitalism and on possibilities for action against racist and capitalist oppression. Sometimes the fronts between Marxists and Postcolonial scholars are so hardened that each critical perspective sees the other as an antagonist to the extent that theoretical, methodological and political differences seem unbridgeable.

Against this background, the Department of Development and Postcolonial Studies at the University of Kassel would like to offer the Conference "Racial Capitalism: Marxism meets Postcolonial Studies" as a platform to intensify anti-racist and anti-capitalist debates, to discuss approaches that can convincingly bring together Marxist and Postcolonial Studies and to formulate strategies for action on the basis of scientific findings on the concept of **racial capitalism**.

At the conference, you will have the opportunity to interact with Gargi Bhattacharyya (University of East London), Kolja Lindner (Université de Vincennes - Paris 8), Vanessa Thompson (Queen's University, online) and Manuela Bojadžijev (Humboldt University Berlin) in the form of keynote speeches and panel discussions. Additionally, it will feature a series of panels in which international scholars will present their research on the relationship between racism and capitalism and discuss the possibilities and challenges of bringing together Marxist and Postcolonial approaches.

IT and Wi-Fi Necessities



The University of Kassel uses the network "eduroam". If you are associated with an institution that also uses this network, you will be able to use your usual authentication details (user ID and password) to log in to eduroam here as well.

Directions to conference venue 5th October 2023

From Tram Station to Gießhaus, Mönchebergstraße 5

- Choose to arrive at Holländischer Platz/Universität tram station.
- Just before the tram stop, when you reach the large traffic crossing, turn left towards Kurt-Wolters-Straße. Follow Kurt-Wolters-Straße along the large glass building right next to the university campus.
- Walk straight along the Kurt-Wolters-Straße till you reach Mönchebergstraße (just after crossing the Mönchebergstraße bus stop).
- Turn left and walk along Mönchebergstraße.
- After crossing the "Institut für Musik"-building you will find the University of Kassel's "Gießhaus" (a small round building), the venue of day 1 of the conference.


Path to follow in order to find panel rooms 0017 and -1029:



Directions to conference venue 6th October 2023

From Tram Station Holländischer Platz/Universität to Campus Center, Moritzstraße 18

- Choose to arrive at Holländischer Platz/Universität tram station.
- Pass the large traffic crossing, towards the building Ingenieurwissenschaften I (large glass building with Kassel University logo in big letters).
- Enter the diagonal path on the campus, called Diagonale, and follow it. Pass university library to the right of you till you reach Zentralmensa.
- At Zentralmensa you slightly turn left, to walk by Zentralmensa to your right side.
- The big grey building to your left sight is the Campus Center, which you
 may recognize by its glass front. It is the venue of day 2 of the
 conference.

Central canteen of the University – for lunch on Friday 06th October at 12:30

- From Campus Center, it is a very short walk to Zentralmensa.

Getting Around: Public Transport System in Kassel

The city is connected to the national rail network at two stations, Kassel Central and Kassel-Wilhelmshöhe. The traditional central station (Hauptbahnhof) has been reduced to a regional station; the high-speed trains InterCityExpress (ICE) and InterCity stop at Kassel-Wilhelmshöhe. Kassel has a well-developed public transport network. All connections can be best visualized within the DB Navigator App. Please note that Google Maps has no access to the public transportation plan of Kassel and might deliver incorrect information.
