Contents: What is the food system approach and what are actors and processes we observe there? Institutions, understood as social rules, are core to these issues. They allow actors to collaborate in resource management and agricultural production and are subject of policies. The course introduces how institutions facilitate collective action, their role in contracts, cooperatives, value chains, policies, property rights and in the food system in general. It connects institutional analysis to the analysis of ecosystem services. Institutional Analysis will be practiced throughout exchanges with policy-makers and stakeholders shaping the European food system, e.g. throughout an excursion to Berlin.
