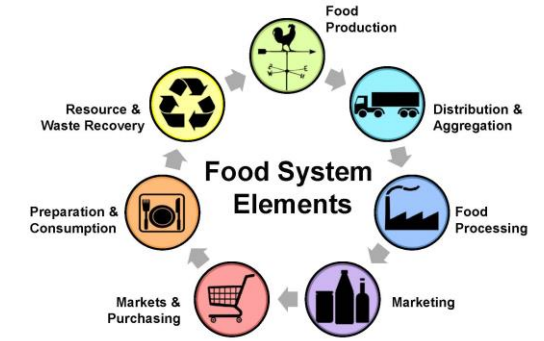

Contents: What are food systems, how is it governed and what are the institutions constituting it? What is the role of Europe for the global food system?

Institutions and governance, understood as social rules, are core to these issues. They allow actors to collaborate in resource management and agricultural production and are subject of policies. The course introduces how institutions shape different food systems and types of production systems through collective action, contracts, cooperatives, value chains, policies, property rights. It connects institutional analysis to the analysis of ecosystem services. **Institutional Analysis will be practiced** throughout exchanges with policy-makers and stakeholders shaping the European food system.
