Experience of difference: Ritualised behaviours in lectures/courses

Joanna is an Erasmus student from Poland who is spending a year at a German university. She is shocked about some of the behaviour in the lectures and courses. She cringes every time the students knock on their desks at the end of a class. In her opinion, the knocking signalises criticism and that the students are unhappy with the lecturer. In Poland, students thank their professor by clapping at the end of a class, and they also applaud if a student contributes to the discussion. Knocking on desktops would be considered rude and lacking respect for the lecturer. Of course, by now Joanna has learned that knocking is a way of expressing approval at German universities; she has got used to it and participates in it, but it continues to startle her somewhat.
